KIBERA MAMAS

Kibera, Kenya is an informal settlement located just outside of Nairobi. It is home to an estimated one million people, many who live on less than \$1 per day.

The Kibera Mamas group was established as a way of developing meaningful work for women in the community. The women gather to make beaded animals which are sold throughout the world. The women receive fair wages for their work, allowing them to buy food, pay their children's school fees, and pay their rent. As they work together they also fellowship and discuss important topics such as family and nutrition. The women pray together and encourage each other.

The Kibera Mamas group offers a brighter future for the participants and their children!
